

The popular Långa Bryggan jetty is more than 600 meters long, and at the end you can take a refreshing dip, pay a relaxing visit to the open-air swimming baths or enjoy a bite to eat in the restaurant.

This is where architecture meets nature!



Lomma beach is a long stretch of dazzling white sand north of Höjeå. It is a popular place for sunbathing and swimming on warm summer days. Långa bryggan, Habo Ljung, Lomma norra and Hamnhusen offer wonderful opportunities for bathing in the shallow Lomma bay.

The beautiful Alnarp Park is home to Sweden's second biggest collection of trees and bushes in terms of species and varieties. Alnarp Castle is situated in the heart of the park and was built for the Agricultural Institute in 1862. The park is popular among both locals and visitors and attracts frequent visits.

Lomma Harbour has plenty of facilities including cafés and restaurants and is within walking distance of Lomma centre. The harbour is home to both fishing boats and pleasure boats. A residential area is emerging on the northern shore of the mouth of the Höje River, with squares, parks, open-air restaurants and waterfront homes.

The Gyllin meadows stretch out in the northern part of the municipality. A nature reserve with lovely walk along the seafront. The mouth of the River Lödde has abundant bird life. Take your binoculars with you and bird-watch from the tower, take a walk, stop and have a barbecue at one of the BBQ spots along the way.
